Receptive and expressive language subtests

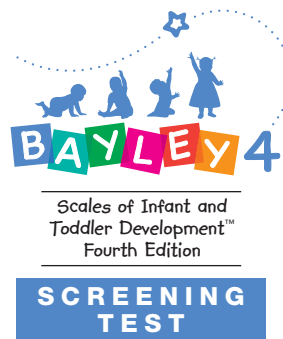


Motor
