Conversational Questions Yes/No Questions Repetition Word Fluency Sentence Completion Responsive Speech Spelled Word Recognition Spelling	 Requires high-quality audio for examinee and examiner Conversational Questions: If needed, refer to clinician's location [i.e., Have you been here (in my office) before?] Yes/No Questions: Items 10-13 modification, if needed, refer to clinician's location [e.g., Are the lights on in (my) room? Is the door closed in (my) room?]; make sure camera is positioned so the examinee can see the door in the clinician's room Word Fluency: Examiner uses stopwatch; examiner must ensure the examinee stops at the time limit
Picture Description Object Naming Reading Irregular Words Reading Non-Words	 Requires high-quality audio and video for examinee and examiner Picture Description, Reading tasks: Share screen and point with the mouse to stimuli; converting to a large cursor size is preferred to help with vision needs of older adults. It is recommended to also have a set of objects in an opaque bag with the facilitator to use as directed by the examiner during the administration.

Sequential Commands	 Ask the facilitator to make sure the examinee has the book, pen, and comb on the table directly in front of the examinee. Peripheral camera/device should be placed in a stable position to show examinee's pointing/responses Item 4: "Point to the window, then to the door" can be replaced with "Point to the floor, then to the ceiling" if needed
Reading Commands	 Ask the facilitator to make sure the examinee has a pencil on the table directly in front of the examinee. Peripheral camera/device should be placed in a stable position to show examinee's pointing/responses Item 4: "Draw a cross with your foot" can be replaced with "Draw a cross with your finger" using the Remote-Adapted Stim Book
Writing Upon Request Writing Irregular Words to Dictation Writing Non-words to Dictation	 Ask the facilitator to make sure the examinee has a piece of unlined paper and a pen on the table directly in front of the examinee Peripheral camera/device should be placed in a stable position to show examinee's written responses Requires high-quality audio for examinee and examiner
Writing Output Copying a Sentence Drawing	 Share screen and point to stimuli with the clinician's mouse Peripheral camera/device should be placed in a stable position to show examinee's written responses Writing Output: Examiner uses stopwatch; examiner must ensure the examinee stops at the 3-minute time limit Drawing: Share screen and show stimuli if needed Take a screenshot of the examinee's output to save for scoring
Writing to Dictation Writing Dictated Words Alphabet and Numbers Dictated Letters and Numbers	 Requires high-quality audio for examinee and examiner Peripheral camera/device should be placed in a stable position to show examinee's written responses Take a screenshot of the examinee's output to save for scoring Writing Dictated Words: Show objects in front of the clinician camera, if needed
Apraxia	 Ask the facilitator to make sure the examinee has relevant objects, a piece of unlined paper, and a phone on the table directly in front of the examinee Peripheral camera/device should be placed in a stable position to show examinee's responses

Subtest(s)	Considerations
Block Design	 A trained facilitator can assist with administration of this subtest. It is not recommended to allow an untrained facilitator to present blocks for Block Design nor to attempt to have the examinee scramble or present their own blocks Ask the facilitator to make sure the examinee has Koh's blocks on the table directly in front of the examinee Peripheral camera/device should be placed in a stable position to show examinee's constructions; examiner also needs peripheral camera to show the demonstration item Share screen and point to stimuli with the clinician's mouse Examiner uses stopwatch; examiner must ensure the examinee stops at the time limit
