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Course Description

Feelings of anxiety play both protective and restrictive roles. As we return to school, we are likely to encounter students who present with feelings of anxiety. It is important to know some easy best practices to aid with back-to-school transition. Likewise, it is important to recognize when unresolved anxiety meets the level of disability and may require more intensive intervention. Common anxiety look-alikes (e.g., ADHD, sensory processing deficits, depression) make the determination of an anxiety disorder, and the appropriate relief, more difficult to ascertain. This intermediate-level webinar will discuss best assessment practices to help parse out some of these look-alike conditions.
